

Title Trivet

Date about 1960

Primary Maker Unknown

Medium Pressed white-colored earthenware tile with brown underglaze enamels

Description Trivet consisting of a square earthenware tile with three, small, green felt circles glued to the back of the tile. These would have prevented the tile from scratching the surface it rested on or from transferring heat from a hot pot placed on the trivet to the surface below. The trivet has a brown transfer-printed pattern and a title in the lower right corner: "LAND ALLOTMENTS/ 1665-1667/ HOMENOSCITT PLANTATION/ CLINTON, CONN." The central design shows

the rectangular plots of land assigned on either side of a river, labeled "INDIAN

RIVER". The plots are labeled with various names and designations: "Wm.
