Description Views of Hartford record the extensive flooding that accompanied the Hurricane of 1938. Floodwaters fill many streets, Bushnell Park, and the meadows along the Connecticut River. The Bulkeley Bridge, the tower of Travelers Insurance Company, the old Y.M.C.A. building, and the Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Arch are visible in some photographs. Signs read: "THE PLYMPTON & HILLS CORP." "SOCONY" "P. BERRY & SONS" "STATE" "SUNKIST". Billboards and water towers are on some rooftops.
