

# Basic Detail Report



## Title Pocket

Date about 1790-1800

Primary Maker Unknown

Medium Hand-stitched block-printed cottons and plain linen

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Description Woman's pocket, made of randomly sized scraps of late eighteenth-century printed cottons. Most of the prints have some sort of floral motif, some are arranged in stripes. Predominate colors are brown, tan, red and blue. The slit is  $9 \frac{3}{8}$  inches long and is bound with three different printed cottons. The patchwork is lined with plain-woven linen, as is the band across the top and the waist tie remnants. The pocket is bound with two different prints, including one plaid, which is cut off-grain to give it a more decorative effect.

Dimensions Primary Dimensions (length x width):  $17 \frac{5}{8} \times 13 \frac{1}{2}$  in. (44.8 x 34.3 cm)
