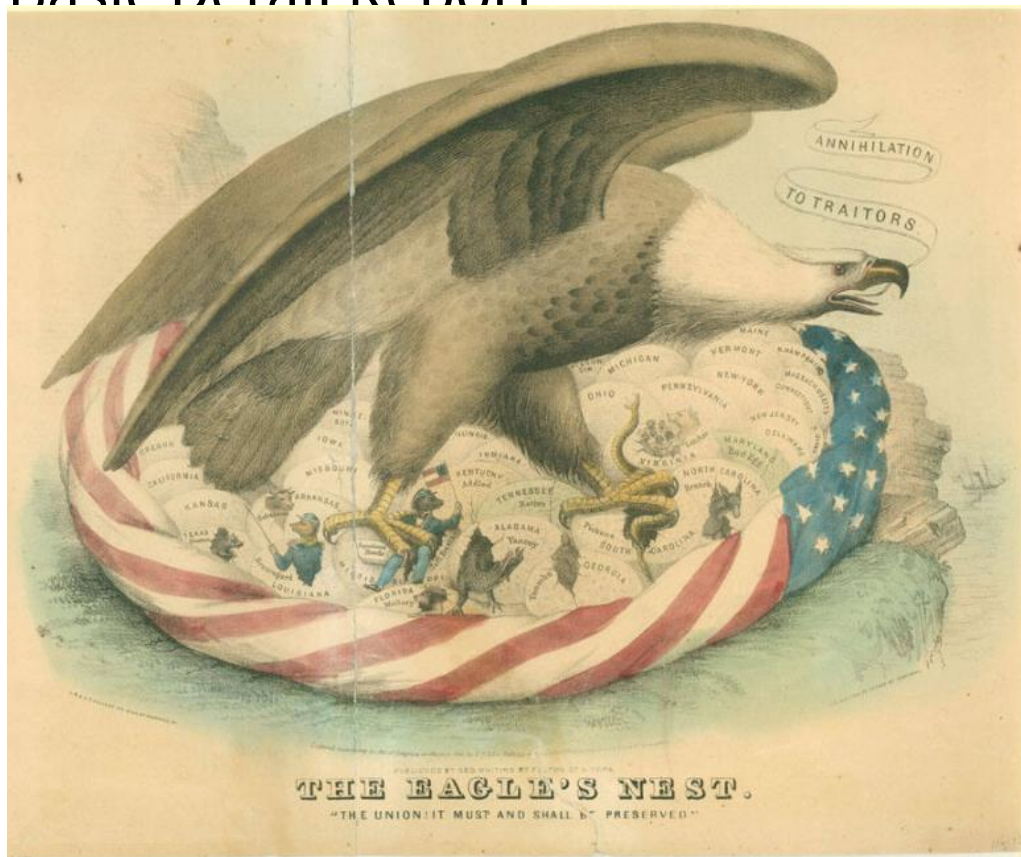


# Basic Detail Report



## Title The Eagle's Nest.

Medium Lithography; printer's ink and watercolor on wove paper

Description A bald eagle is standing on a nest full of eggs. The nest is on a cliff and is made of a twisted American flag.
